Tech Tip - Dance Audiences are Untercent Joe's tech tip focused on differences in playing for dance audiences verses concert audiences. He emphasized, unless one was playing for professional dancers, general dancers need to hear the music and prefer a steady non-changing beat. That basically indicates a playing style of constant hearable volume and constant tempo. Concert playing tended to be more focused on aural quality -addressing listing traits/feelings. Thus it tended to be much more mood/voice, dynamic focused, and tempo directive. He played "If You Go Away" in a classical style and "Theme From the Godfather" in a Latin style to demonstrate how songs could be positioned using these principals.



Renowned accordionist, Evan Harlan, will be the featured guest artist at our September meeting on Sunday, September 28, 2008, beginning at 1:00 PM at the Dolphin Seafood Restaurant in Natick, MA. The program will combine a solo performance by Harlan, as well as a workshop session during which Harlan will discuss the music he plays and some of the techniques he employs.

Evan Harlan is a professor of contemporary improvisation at the New England Conservatory of Music, and the leader of a quartet - Andromeda4. His other musical pursuits include composing and directing. Harlan plays several keyboard instruments, but his special affection for the accordion is clearly evident. He uses a vintage Excelsior accordion, as well as a recently acquired Victoria allwood, free-bass accordion - which is a feast for the eyes as well as the ears.

Andromeda4 plays original music with the flavors of Americana, tango, gypsy and other passionate traditions. Harlan's former quartet - named Excelsior - featured unusual arrangements of classical compositions by mixing in improvisation and unorthodox textures. Harlan has also recorded and performed internationally with many jazz and world music ensembles, including the Dave Douglas Group, the Klezmer Conservatory Band, and the Von Trapp Singers.

Accordions Now Festival

Joe Maciejowski, Dan Mackowiak and Al Paradis described their recent experience having attended and performed with the festival orchestra at the "Accordion Now" - August 2 at the Radisson Hotel Manchester, NH. The featured performer was Tony Lovello. Mary Tokarski also gave a detail seminar on over-coming nervousness while playing solo. Various accordion workshops, dancing, singing and door prizes were held during this day long event.

Joe Maciejowski, Jerry Tramontozzi, Carmen Vitanza and Bob & Anita Siarkowski also performed intermission sessions. The NH Accordion Club and the Accordion Connection had special thanks to the MAAA for their efforts and support. Plans were being formulated for a similar event next year.

We all probably have heard about the great accordionist Pietro Deiro. But did you know that his older brother Guido was a great Italian-American accordion performer, recording artist, composer, and teacher, who, along with his younger brother Pietro Deiro, was of paramount importance in the popularization of the piano-accordion in the early 20th-century and the inauguration of the 50-year "Golden Age of the Accordion" (1910-1960). Some tidbits you should know about Pietro's older brother Guido......In February 1909, Guido Deiro was the first star of the piano-accordion (first concert: Guerrini Musical Instrument Manufacturing Company, San Francisco), Guido Deiro was the first piano-accordionist to perform on the vaudeville stage, he was also the first to coin the name "piano accordion" and he also was Mae West's first husband.
