Knoff Performance Wows the Audience!



Jon Richard Knoff, along with his daughter Kassandra and son Johan, performed for the MAAA at its March 22 session. The Knoffs play the chromatic

button accordion – and they played wonderfully! The performance was presented as part of the MAAA's quest artist series.

Jon began the concert with three solo renditions, including two Frosini compositions. Johan then took the stage for a solo performance of Piazzola's Libertango, followed by a duet with his Dad. Kassandra next performed a spectacular free-base version of Bach's Toccata. Jon then played two selections on a chromatic button accordion fitted with a MIDI system. Finally, Jon and Kassandra collaborated on several duet pieces, culminating with the American Wooden Shoe Polka by Nils Lundin.

Jon began playing accordion in his native Norway, and continued his training at

the college level in the United States. Kassandra is 14 years old; Johan is 12 years old. Their current instructor resides in Montreal, Canada. (Since the Knoffs live in Randolph, VT, the biweekly trip is a mere 150 miles.) No doubt, however, the special attention has borne exceptional results.

At the conclusion of the concert, Jon spent some time explaining the history of the chromatic button accordion, as well as the features that make it the instrument of choice for so many of the finest accordion players in the world. Jon and Kassandra then fielded questions from the audience. Many were interested in the playing techniques employed compared to those used when playing the familiar piano accordion.

Indeed, their instruments captured the interest of the accordion players in the audience; but, the excellent musicianship of Jon, Kassandra and Johan captivated

'Weird Al' Is Stoked About His Digital Accordion

Sonic chameleon "Weird Al" Yankovic has been many things to many people over the years, shifting through a bewildering number of styles for his pop music parodies. Since he shared a surname with a top polka musician, his first musical instrument was naturally the accordion. His Al-ness does have one quibble with his instrument of origin: It's a pain in the ass to record.

The accordion is a hard instrument to mike, because if you put an acoustic microphone next to an accordion -- especially the left hand -- the bellows are always moving," he told Roland Insider. "So it's kind of hard to get an even sound, because the mike is always going to be closer and then further away from the sound source. Internal microphones are also always a problem, because you still get the sound of the bellows."


American Accordionists Association Even

May 6, 2009 has been established the first ever World Accordion Day by the

Confederation Internationale des Accordeonistes (CIA).

That date marks the 180th anniversary of the first patent for a musical instrument called an "accordion." The CIA undertook the global commemoration project as a way to celebrate the diversity of the instrument and the musicians who play it.

The Massachusetts Accordion Association celebrates accordions and accordion players each time it comes together. So, the MAAA will be joining the World Accordion Day festivities at its regular monthly session on April 26, 2009 - beginning at 1:30 PM at VFW Post 1274 on 113 West Central St. in Natick, MA. There will be a brief discussion session about the beginnings of the accordion, as well as an opportunity to collectively create a musical tribute.

The Confederation Internationale des Accordionistes is currently comprised of member associations from 28 countries. Its purpose is to promote accordion excellence around the world. Among other activities, the Confederation sponsors the Coupe Mondiale - the annual international competition among accordion players.
