Just wanted to share with you on my trip to Totowa, NJ to experience the new Roland FR-7x V-Accordion. This was an

invitation to experience the very first two FR-7x accordions in the U.S. and it was well worth the trip. Roland's own Ron Lankford and Alex Chudolij of MusicMagic USA were there to handle the technical questions, and based on the attending guests, the questions were extremely informative.

Cory Pesaturo, the Coupe Mondiale Digital Accordion World Champion and Peter Chudolij, the U.S. V-accordion juniors division champion gave a mini-concert using the FR-7x. What a great example of the multiple styles of playing enabled by the newer technology.

Eddie Monteiro, one of the greatest jazz performers to trickle the accordion keys gave the FR-7x a true workout. From his performance, you would never need a sound generator added to your accordion again. The features of the vibes, different temperaments of the scat voices, percussion variations of the basses, the different programmability of the organs, the enhancement of the multiple additional Hammond organ sounds, more strings, more memory banks (80 in all, with #'ss 44-80 for your own self programmed sound combinations), bellows controllability through a breath valve (making the bellows shake performance a standard, not the exception with a Roland) and finally, most importantly to many, like myself, visually challenged, a much easier to read display (black background with white lettering).

Although the FR-7x looks like the FR-7 on the outside, the internals are totally different. It is not just a software enhancement, but a more improved electronics upgrade. So, if you currently own an FR-7, still a truly remarkable accordion, you cannot upgrade it to an FR-7x. You will need to buy the FR-7x to get all the new features.

Thank you to Alex and Lilliana of MusicMagic USA for inviting me to "taste and feel" this new FR-7x from Roland.
