JEREMIAH McLANE PERFORMANCE

Periodically, the MAAA presents a guest artist at its monthly get-together - and on October 25, accordionist Jeremiah McLane was in the spotlight. For the predominant portion of his performance, Jeremiah took the audience on a tour of the French countryside by playing tunes that demonstrated various styles of traditional French music. While McLane plays a Petosa piano accordion, he cleverly uses its treble and bass registers, along with skillful bellows technique, to mimic the accordion sound that is unique to each style. As an added feature of the musical tour, he included picturesque stories about French culture and history.

Jeremiah is involved in several musical projects, including recording, composing and teaching. He currently teaches at the Floating Bridge Music School, of which he is the founder, and at the State University of New York in Plattsburgh, NY. In addition, McLane conducts seminars and workshops. During his performance for the MAAA last Sunday, Jeremiah McLane mentioned a weekend workshop that he will be conducting in Vermont, beginning Friday evening, December 4, and concluding mid-day Sunday, December 6. The topic is Improvisation - and the session looks like a wonderful opportunity to learn and relax. There is a one-page flyer accompanying this newsletter that provides the details.
