It seems I often mention "fun" in this monthly article - because it's fun to do what the MAAA does.

At our April meeting, we had an opportunity to do something new that was really fun. At the end of

the regular Play-Along session, we split into four small groups. Each group was given the music for one of the parts of a short, four-part fugue, and asked to practice it for approximately ten minutes. We then reconstituted the Play-Along group, and worked on putting the four parts together.

No one in the group (other than me) had heard the piece before, and most had never played a fugue before. The melody is obscure in places and, as is common with the fugue structure, the different parts overlap and weave in and out of each other forming a continuous musical tapestry. So, as the separate groups were practicing the individual parts, there were a lot of guizzical facial expressions.

time. We then took the plunge and played them together.

Well, the truth be told - there were still a lot of quizzical facial expressions after that first attempt. We tried it again, and then a couple more times. After the fourth run-through, we got the piece to a listenable level. Everyone in the Play-Along group felt good about our joint accomplishment. Suffice it to say - it was FUN! Because of the popular demand, we will attempt another fugue at the June meeting.

The Play-Along group will be the "warm-up" act before Paul Monte's quest artist presentation at our next meeting on May 22. The list of music we will be playing was included in an earlier e-mail message to MAAA members. We are expecting several visitors at the May meeting in connection with Paul's appearance - including members of the New Hampshire Accordion Association who may join us in the Play-Along session. That will be fun, too.

related to her field of study which is Chinese art conservation. Melody sent an e-mail message a few weeks ago to let us know what is going on her side of the world.

Dear Boston...friends,

...I hope you are well, warm, and excited for the coming spring. The weather in Taipei has been rather dreary all winter, and yesterday, Boston's temperature high was higher than that of here! I am anxiously awaiting summer's arrival, when the sun will be out and eating shaved ice will become a daily necessity.

Since my arrival in Taipei I have been studiously attending Chinese classes, and am glad to report that can now converse in simple conversation and read basic texts. It certainly helps to be immersed

in Taiwan where ordering food requires either reading or speaking in Chinese. I have also been working at a private scroll mounting studio where I have been involved with the treatment of over seventy paintings and works of art (too many to count), which, although exhausting at times, is an absolute blessing. My six months here have passed by with lighting speed, but I have great hopes that the next half a year plus will bring even more challenging work and language proficiency. I hope that if you have an opportunity to come to Taiwan that you take advantage.

Thankfully we have not suffered directly from the Japanese catastrophe, although the daily reports on their ongoing struggles are a constant reminder of how fragile our seemingly steady lives can become.

Paul Monte to Appear at MAAA Meeting on May 22

Accordionist, Paul Monte, will be the guest artist at the meeting of the Massachusetts Accordion Association (MAAA) on Sunday, May 22, 2011 at the Ciociaro Social Club (formerly the Nonantum Branch Library), 144 Bridge Street in Newton, MA. The MAAA music session begins at 1:30 PM and the guest artist presentation begins at 2:15 PM.

MAAA meetings are open to the public; admission is free.

Monte's program will combine a performance and a workshop. The performance will include bassist Tal Shalom-Kobi, and feature music from

the duo's recently released recording entitled **Songstyles**. The workshop will address some of the special techniques Paul uses when playing the accordion. It will be an opportunity for players and non-players to learn more about the instrument in the hands of an expert.

Paul Monte has long been one of New England's leading accordionists – having played at many of the finest venues and with renowned musicians and entertainers. The music he loves to play runs the gamut of styles that place the accordion in the spotlight, including European and Argentinean melodies, the American songbook, and classic showpieces.

He opened the first Paul Monte Music Studio in 1952 and has been involved in music education ever since. Paul is particularly proud of the accomplishments of his students - some of which achieved championship status at the state level. As one of the founding members of the Accordion Teachers Association of Massachusetts, Paul's influence on the advancement of music education - and the study of the accordion - has been widespread.

Tal Shalom-Kobi, a native of Israel, holds degrees from the Berklee College of Music and the New England Conservatory. She is also a music educator who has an active performance career.

The MAAA is a group of accordion enthusiasts. It conducts monthly meetings designed to encourage and enhance enjoyment of the accordion by its members and to facilitate sharing accordion music with the community. Players of all skill levels and of various types of accordions participate. Newcomers and the general public are cordially welcome. And from the March "places" set we will play: Tennessee Waltz. New York. New York and America.


