## Paul Monte & Tal Shalom-Kobi







What a great performance at our May meeting. Paul Monte on the accordion and Tal Shalom-Kobi and the bass. Truly an enjoyable listening experience.

Paul also held a workshop covering many topics, in summary:

proper alignment of the keyboard in relation to the chin (and why),

left hand strap alignment,

Fingering used in playing the bass (both 4/3 and 3/2 fingers are correct, never change, always stay with what you learned),

bellows shake technique-not left to right shake, but left hand up and down, Paul demo'd the bellows shake with his left hand out of the strap to show the up and down way for the bellow shake,

Cressandos—use your fingernails like runners on a sled to up.....use your thumbs to cressando down,

Do not break the bellows flow at improper places during a song—keep notes in the "flow". Only change the bellows direction when you change a note.

Swell/staccato of bellows gives songs some "punch" and character.

To create a vibrato effect, shaking the right hand or tapping for the treble effect, shaking the left hand for the bass effect.

Matching bass chords with treble chord combinations, eg. Augmented chord patterns and 5ths, Accordion maintenance, Packing the accordion and support the bass buttons/ cleaning your accordion. Examples of different tempo patterns for tangos.


