to Honor Tony Lovello, August 12-13

Tony Lovello, proclaimed "the living legend of the accordion world" and known widely as "The Liberace of the Accordion"

and "King of the Bellow Shake," will be the featured guest artist and special honoree at ACCORDIONS NOW! 2011.

The fourth annual ACCORDIONS NOW! Music Festival will be held Friday-Saturday, August 12-13, at a beautiful new location, the Nashua Courtyard Marriott, Nashua, New Hampshire.

Tony Lovello, Rita Davidson, and Evan Harlan [featured in a separate article, this issue] will perform at the Gala Concert on Saturday evening following the Gala Banquet.

"ACCORDIONS NOW! owes its very existence to Tony Lovello," co-founder Donna Maria Regis explains. "The idea for a New England accordion festival was inspired by Tony's performance at the first concert ever co-sponsored by the New Hampshire Accordion Association [NHAA] and Accordion Connection LLC." From the success of that inaugural event, Regis, NHAA's Music Director, and festival co-founder Suzanne Welch of Accordion Connection, brought the concept of ACCORDIONS NOW! to fruition, and, with Lovello's personal guidance, have made it an annual success. The ACCORDIONS NOW! 2011 Festival Orchestra's program, states Regis, offers "a musical 'thank you' to the festival's guiding light, Tony Lovello."


