Want to know how to diagnose and repair your own accordion? Check out AccordionRevival.com, a website dedicated to helping people repair their own accordions. Currently displaying 32 illustrated articles on diagnosing the most common problems and making the most commonly needed repairs, the site is a significant new resource to accordion players all over the English speaking world.

Currently posted articles address changing reed leathers, freeing sticking keys, trouble-shooting silent reeds, voicing reeds, finding air leaks, waxing reeds, replacing bellows gaskets, installing rhinestones, replacing bellows tape, installing a new bellows, properly adjusting keyboards and bass machines, and much more. Website owner George Bachich, of Napa, California, says more articles are on the way, and that the site will eventually be a complete reference on repairing and tuning accordions, including detailed step by step instructions on how to make all kinds of repairs, where to get the proper materials and parts, and how to make the special tools needed for each task. It is amply illustrated with close up color photographs of the repairs in progress.

Our December featured performers....

Thanks to Tony Marini, we have featured performers for our December meeting.....

During a discussion with a member of the Ciociaro Social Club, an appearance of Fratelli Rocca was offered. After discussing this potential, we engaged Fratelli Rocca to appear at our December 16, 2012 meeting.

Fratelli Rocca are two brothers that were born in Sora Italy, which is about a half hour north of where many members of the Ciociaro Social Club originated. They have been studying accordion since the age of 7 and focused on Neapolitan music. Members thought it would different for us to see and hear very ethnic playing and performing.

They are here because the Ciociaro Social Club and other Italian American clubs in the area seek their performance over the Christmas season the past few years.

Fratelli Rocca (Brothers Rocca)

The brothers Antonio and Benedetto Rocca are both born in Sora in province of Frosinone, Italy in 1973 and 1975.

They began to study music to the 7-year-old age and from immediately their passion was the accordion. Weird this passion was born in them to the beginnings of the eighties, just when the accordion seemed to be limited to a folk and popular litato. They studied under the Teacher Carlesimo, self-taught person for how much pertains the technical fisarmonicistica, but student of harmony and theory, of the composer Samuel Pagan.

The Brothers Rocca, began the shows to the age respectively of 14 and 12 years, with the duet of accordions, leading to the caution of the public in varied shows in central Italy and in mainly tourist zones the classic repertory of the accordion, performed with the elaboration and the arrangements of the pieces marked with a style just so from not to confuse itself ever with the enforceable with a style 'too classic' of the accordion.

The end of the eighties and the beginnings of the years ninety restored to the limelight, in a lot of areas of Italy, the folk song, the Neapolitan repertory, the dance and therefore the smooth one. In 1997 and for many years thereafter, they appeared in the United States, Canada, France and Ireland and to play for the numerous community Italian residents.

At present in Italy they play in trio with the singing percussionist Tony Cardone. Besides other varieties activity 'the Fratelli Rocca' (so called in the United States and in Ireland) teach the accordion to boys and girls.


