MAAA's March meeting will be big!



Our February meeting was cancelled because of snow (sigh) but we are making up for it this month! The <u>Lou Borelli Octet</u> will be the featured performers at MAAA's March meeting. Jan Borelli, an MAAA member, who usually plays piano in the group, will be playing accordion. Her husband, Lou, will be on trumpet and vocals. The other instruments in the band are tenor sax, trombone, baritone sax, bass, guitar, and drums.

We've never had such a big group perform before so this will be a unique treat for members and their friends. Each band member is a seasoned professional, and the band will perform an exciting and diverse program. Come early to get a seat--this meeting is sure to be standing room only. The Octet performs arrangements originally created by the Dave Pell Octet, one of the bands credited with the creation of the West Coast Jazz scene in the 1950s. Shorty Rogers and Marty Paich were the first arrangers to showcase the unique sound of this group.

New England Music Festival takes place April 10-12 in Newton, MA

The New England Music Festival will be held April 10-12, 2015 at the Newton Marriott in Newton, MA. Sponsored by the Accordion Teachers Association of Massachusetts, the Festival is an annual musical competition and 2015 marks its 53rd year. The Festival averages more than 2000 entries and over 700 contestants from all across New England.



All events are free and open to the public. Entry fees for contestants vary by category. During the festival, contestants, ages through 22, take part in accordion, guitar, bass guitar, drum, percussion, piano, violin and voice competitions.

Non-competitive categories include evaluation solos and festival group divisions. Contestants must be students of ATAM members. More than \$4,000 in cash will be awarded throughout the weekend.

The three-day event takes place Friday through Sunday. On Friday evening and Sunday, a Junior-Senior Battle of the Bands competition takes place in the Grand Ballroom. Saturday and Sunday, continuous group competitions and Entertainment Solos are held in the Grand Ballroom. Solo and duet competitions are ongoing. The Championship competition is held on Friday evening.

Saturday evening's awards banquet, attended by more than 400 people, will include a \$500 scholarship and cash awards and trophies presented to Championship, Entertainment, all NE Cup Solos, and Improvised Drum contestants.

Also at the banquet, Mary Tokarski will be recognized as a Lifetime Honorary Member of the ATAM.

Students will be able to have fun at a Dance Party on Saturday evening.

Internationally famous accordionist, Cory Pesaturo, will be performing in concert on Sunday afternoon in the Grand Ballroom.
